Serving Those Who Served for Us

The Happy Trails Riding Academy Equine Services for Heroes (ESH) program has assisted military veterans and active service members since 2013 by providing leadership and guidance through equine assisted activities and therapies. To date, over 50 veterans have participated in the ESH program.

The purpose behind providing ESH is to offer hope and encourage physical, cognitive, social and emotional growth through the power of the equine. This program aims to create confident, consistent, dependable, quiet horsemen and women who are developing a trusting relationship with a horse and, hopefully, taking and applying these lessons to their everyday lives.

An informational flyer shared by a co-worker brought Herb Schneider to Happy Trails in June 2019. He found an instant connection with Cash in his first class. "It was an

awesome experience, one that I've never felt with anyone or anything." He continues, "I think I relate so well with Cash because I've seen him startle easily and recover from clumsy situations like I often do."

When describing a class experience Lead instructor, Cathy Fitzpatrick says, "I feel like my job as an instructor is more of a 'facilitator'. I let the horses do most of the work." She continues, "sometimes the bond between the veteran and horse is especially strong as Herb has indicated. His horse Cash actually chose him as his partner."

Jayne Inman referred herself after seeing Happy Trails while driving back and forth to the Tulare VA clinic. She knew it was the right program for her when at the last class of her session she was allowed to trot Whiskey for the first time, "it was the first time since deployment I've felt pure joy and happiness."

The success of therapeutic horsemanship is largely due to the nature of the animals with which the veteran is interacting. Therapy horses are nonjudgmental and do not

The partnership between horses and the military has been apparent for centuries. Happy Trails is proud to continue this tradition by giving veterans an opportunity to learn from these amazing animals.

Taking Happy Trails Live!

The COVID-19 pandemic may have closed schools and businesses leaving many sheltered in home, it hasn't completely shut down Happy Trails. While classes are canceled temporarily we are still engaging with our riders, volunteers and supporters by streaming live on Facebook every Wednesday and Friday at 2:00 pm (PDT). The entire staff and members of the Happy Trails herd have been involved in front of and behind the camera producing 15-minute short programs on topics including--parts of the horse, story time with Abigail and preparing feed for 19 horses. Our first story garnered nearly 1000 views with comments coming in from states throughout the country; Nebraska, Wyoming and Maryland to name a few. Shows will continue until we are back to our normal class schedule.
